

Thomas Cecil, 1st Earl of Exeter spent time in Wimbledon as a child and so liked it that he later built a grand manor house in the area, on land owned by his father. Cecil lived there with his wife and 13 children, becoming Lord of the Manor in 1589. He served in Elizabeth I's government, and his grand house and gardens impressed Elizabeth who visited at least three times. James I was also a visitor.
